
Myth: Measles vaccine, given as measles, mumps and rubella (MMR), causes autism.

Fact: Measles cases are rising throughout the world, country and province. Vaccination is the only way to protect yourself from measles.

Public Health seeks immunizers and clerical support for 2025 respiratory virus season





During the months of October and November, Public Health administers COVID and influenza vaccine to all community members throughout the region during respiratory virus season.

In 2024, public health hosted 81 clinics in 42 different communities across the Interlake-Eastern region and administered over 13,000 COVID and Influenza immunizations. These clinics would not be possible without nursing and support staff.

We are reaching out to all nursing and clerical support staff at this time to recruit for the 2025 respiratory virus season. Clinics occur Monday through Saturday, starting end of October until the end of November. Days, evening and weekend clinics occur in most communities in the region.

IERHA will be hosting two Accreditation Canada Surveyors **May 26 to 30, 2025**. Health-care accreditation is an ongoing process of assessing health care and social services organizations against standards of excellence to identify what is being done well and what needs to be improved.

The last time we had a visit was in June 2023, and our region was assessed on 22 standards. This year, we have moved to a provincial sequential model, and only five standards will be assessed including:

- Governance (Board of Directors)
- Leadership
- Infection Prevention & Control
- Medication Management
- Emergency & Disaster Management
- Surveyors will be assessing the above standards at the following sites:
- Selkirk Regional Health Centre
- Beausejour Health Centre
- Gimli Community Health Centre
- Stonewall & District Health Centre


Health regions represented as a group rather than individually creating an impressive booth. The event attracted approximately 1,100 physicians, residents and medical students from Canada and the U.S.

Recently IERHA's Jamie Boyer, manager of Indigenous Health, and Patrice Lee, director of health services - acute, spoke with a Gr. 12 class on public health care in Manitoba. The class was held in the Eagle's Nest room at Transcona Collegiate, and everyone was seated in a circle to facilitate conversation.

Content discussed included:

- Universal health care in Manitoba: how public health care is funded, accessed, what services are covered, and funding for First Nations Communities
- Barriers to health access: challenges with long wait times, rural and Indigenous health care access, language barriers and socioeconomic factors
- Preventative health programs: public health initiatives like vaccinations, mental health programs and chronic disease prevention
- Lessons learned from COVID 19: public health measures, vaccine distribution and the impact on the health-care system

The students were actively engaged and asked questions about ethics in health care, questioned jurisdictional issues in the delivery of health care services and asked our thoughts on public versus private health care.

It was a pleasure to speak with the class about universal healthcare, COVID-19 and the barriers to health-care services, particularly for Indigenous communities. The opportunity was truly appreciated to participate in such an important discussion with the leaders of tomorrow.

Health-care and dental plans premium increases: Effective June 1, 2025



To help maintain the financial stability of the plans, the Healthcare Employees' Benefits Plan (HEBP) board of trustees has approved premium increases for the health-care and dental plans effective June 1, 2025.

These increases are required due to ongoing inflationary pressures and a continued increase in the number of claims for paramedical practitioner services such as massage therapists, physiotherapists and chiropractors.

Premiums are deducted one month before the effective month of coverage. If you are enrolled in single coverage, the overall increase for both plans is \$2.27 per month. For family coverage, the overall increase for both plans is \$6.08 per month.
