The New Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) in Manitoba learning module is now available in the Shared Health Learning Management System (LMS).

This online module provides information on MAiD in Canada, the MAiD process in Manitoba, health-care providers and team member roles, what to do if a patient requests MAiD, abstaining facilities, psychosocial resources, and federal and provincial statistics.

This course is intended for new and current staff who work in health care in Manitoba. It is all online and can be completed at your own pace; it does not need to be completed in one sitting. There are no prerequisites.

The course is hosted in the Shared Health Learning Management System (LMS), which is accessible from any Internet connection.
